Date: Tuesday, August 15, 2023, Time: 10:00 AM

Description: The Dimensions of Quality highlights 4 components; property & design administration, property & housing management, supportive services, and community. The Pandemic activated a global loss. The world is still trying to manage the impact of the Pandemic. People are still grappling with the trauma of this moment in time. The unhoused community is still recuperating. This peer-to-peer conversation will talk through how to support staff and consumers.

Title: Implementing A Housing First Program

Date: Tuesday, September 19, 2023, Time: 1:00 PM

Description: Housing First is a human right. It's providing people with safe places to live and be able to marshal their thoughts, feelings, and energy toward aspects of their lives that have necessarily been less attended to in the daily effort simply to survive. Housing First is a residential service and program ideal that also provides an opportunity to explore safer self-care and personal aspirations and achievements. How do we cultivate housing services that optimally embody person-centered, trauma aware, and incorporate harm reduction and motivational interviewing? What's the blueprint and best standard of practice? What's needed to provide support to those who live with housing instability, substance use, mental illness, poverty, and discrimination? Let's find out.

Title: Reframing Case Management

Description: The conversation will focus on how homelessness and supportive housing can be more person-centered in language and practice. It is often stated that "Residents/Tenants are people to be supported and not cases to be managed." We will discuss new approaches to terminology and approach in direct service. Title: Dimensions of Quality through the Sustainability Lens

Community) with an emphasis on creating long-term advocacy, policy, and infrastructure for quality supportive housing.
